EUDR Checklist | Ethiopian Coffee Exporters

Ensure full traceability to farm plots with GPS coordinates, verify no deforestation after 31 Dec 2020, and retain evidence of legal production and export for every shipment.

Traceability

Can you trace each export lot back to farms?

1

- Every export lot has a list of farmers and farms/plots it came from
- You can show a clear path:
Farmer → Cooperative/Washing station → Warehouse lot → Export shipment
- You don't mix unknown coffee into lots going to the EU

Farm location (geolocation)

This is the main EUDR requirement

- **For every farm/plot that supplies the EU shipment, you have:**
 - GPS coordinates (best: polygon boundary, acceptable: point)
 - Farmer name/ID and plot ID
 - You can export the farm coordinates as a file (CSV, Excel, etc.)

Deforestation rule (simple test)

- You confirm:** No coffee comes from land deforested after 31 Dec 2020
- If the farm is near forests, you keep extra evidence (field visit / satellite check from buyer)

Legality

Basic proof that production/export is legal

- Exporter business license + tax documents
- Cooperative/union registration (if applicable)
- Proof coffee was legally sourced (farm registration/membership records)

Deliver the “EUDR Data Pack” to your EU buyer

Every EU shipment should have:

- List of plots/farms with coordinates
- Farmer/plot IDs linked to export lots
- Traceability records (lot creation + intake logs)
- Legality docs (licenses/registrations)
